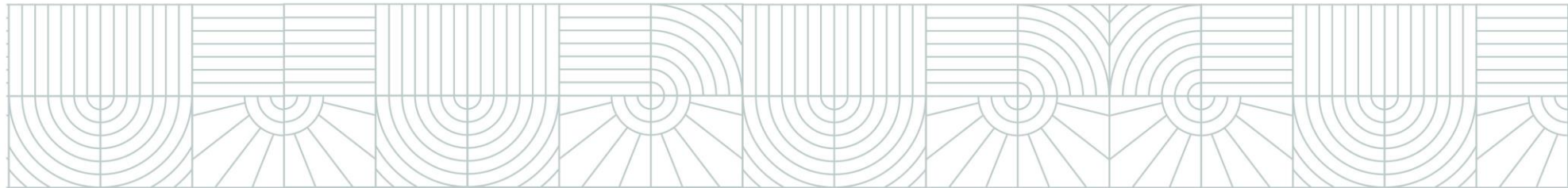
COP16: A Moonshot Moment for Land

"Look again at that dot. That's here. That's home. That's us. On it everyone you love, everyone you know, everyone you ever heard of, every human being who ever was, lived out their lives. The Earth is the only world known so far to harbor life. There is nowhere else, at least in the near future, to which our species could migrate. Visit, yes. Settle, not yet. Like it or not, for the moment the Earth is where we make our stand."

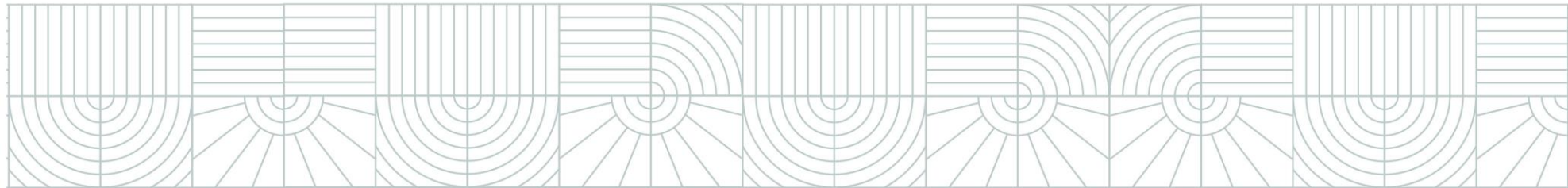

- The Conference of the Parties (COP), UNCCD's main decision-making body, comprises its 197 Parties and steers the Convention's response to global and national needs.
- COP16 is a landmark event to raise global ambition and accelerate action on **land and drought resilience** through a people-centered approach.



- An opportunity to reset current trajectory of land degradation and shape a world where land sustains **future generations**
- The first major UN conference hosted by the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.
- The first time a UNCCD COP is held in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region
